District 8 Quick Facts



What is an AA District?

- A collection of AA Groups, generally geographically located close to one another (or in some instances, connected by language)
- A voice (represented through the District Committee Member of DCM) for the Groups in the District to and from the Area and its General Service Conference Conference Delegate
- A hub for interaction/communication among its Groups and to the Area or General Service office

What is District 8?

A District in Area 10 (state of Colorado)
 covering AA groups in Pueblo, Freemont,
 Custer, Huerfano and Las Animas
 Counties - there is no requirement for a
 Group to participate in District activities
 but there are benefits in doing so.


What does a District Committee do and how might it benefit a participating Group?

- Facilitate interaction among the District Groups to carry the message to still suffering alcoholics (Tradition 5) - this happens principally through the monthly District Committee meeting for discussions and idea sharing, and through District events (like Unity Day!)
- Represent the voice of the District
 Groups at Area Assemblies to present AA
 ideas, issues and concerns to the Area
 and our Delegate (and report back key
 information from these events)
- Facilitate groups wishing to engage in supporting Tradition 5 for Corrections and Treatment
- Outreach to inform about AA through Public information and Cooperation with Professional Communities
- Other activities as per the conscience of the GSR's-the District serves the Groups!



How do District 8 Groups interact with their District Committee?

- Each AA Group that wants to participate within the District elects a General Service Representative (GSR) who attends and participates in the monthly District 8 Committee meetings and activities
- The GSR/s are the core of the District Committee; they do elect (DCM) to represent their voice of the District 8 Committee to Area 10 and also other Trusted Servants (Alt-DCM, Treasurer and Secretary) to facilitate the Committee's activities and serve the groups.
- The District also Supports Standing
 Committees for supporting AA
 involvement in certain communities (e.g.
 Corrections).


